Our Bus Ads Are a Hit!



We know from various sources that our ads on three city buses and in two public parking garages are getting a lot of favorable attention. But we were unprepared for the highest compliment of all: a request last month from the Secretariat of Health for the State of Guanajuato for permission to send photos of the ads to other health jurisdictions in the state and to health officials at the federal level, as a model for their use throughout Mexico.

We are delighted to make copies of our ads available to the Mexican state and federal authorities and to animal-welfare groups in other cities so that they can use them too. We ask only that they send us photos of their own versions of the ads.

The ads encourage members of the public to treat

their dogs and cats with respect and to report cases of abuse to the authorities. The ads appear not only on the backs of the buses, but also on marquees inside them. We estimate that about 10,000 people see each ad every day.

To date, 13 ads have appeared. Each includes a photograph and a brief message, followed by our name and website. An Amigos board member designed the ads. Each ad runs for three months. The three buses have separate routes, and one bus has no set route. The owner of the buses, Ernesto Puga Serafín, gave Amigos a discount from his usual commercial rate.

The ad campaign was made possible initially by a grant from the Alice Morgan Wright–Edith J. Good Trust of Gaithersburg, Maryland, U.S.A. Recently we

received an anonymous donation that has enabled us to expand the series, buy spots on a local TV station, place ads in several local newspapers, and reproduce educational materials for local dissemination. We are

very grateful to both donors and to Sr. Puga for making it possible for us to expand our public education program in such an effective way.

112 Animals Sterilized during Our November Campaign

A team of Amigos volunteers conducted our third campaign of the year on the weekend of November 12–13, sterilizing 112 dogs and cats — 53 female dogs, 7 male dogs, 38 female cats, and 14 male cats. The campaign was held in two classrooms at the primary school Maestro Justo Sierra in El Encino, a Guanajuato City neighborhood. Six veterinarians from Guanajuato, two from León, and three from the United States participated in the campaign with support from members of the community, including several students from

Guanajuato’s Official Preparatory High School.

This was our 29th campaign offering this important service to pet owners unable to afford veterinarians’ usual charges for the surgery. While pet owners waited for their animals to be sterilized, volunteers talked with them about the appropriate care of their animals and held a rummage sale to help pay for our sterilization and rescue activities. Two families and a local Bed & Breakfast hosted the foreign vets, and volunteers from the hostel of the General Hospital provided lunch to our volunteers on both days.

We learned with sadness after the campaign that a female dog that had been treated for internal bleeding after undergoing the surgery died the following night. Although pet owners are warned of the risks of the procedure, we make every effort to ensure that animals are given the best care during our campaigns.

We are grateful to the veterinarians Manuel Elías, María Eugenia Herrera, Felipe Manríquez, Miguel Ochoa, Juan Manuel Rayas, and Moisés Rivera of Guanajuato, Juan Ortiz and Raul Saenz of León, and Lori Bierbrier, Nicole Eaton, Marsha Heinke of the United States for offering their professional services to Amigos for the campaign. We also thank the director and teachers of Maestro Justo Sierra for allowing us to use their school, and we express our warm appreciation to the volunteers who assisted with publicity, preparation of the classrooms, registration, anesthesia, surgery, and recovery. Nochebuenas from Amigos Brighten the Holidays

For the second year in a row we have sold potted *nochebuenas* (poinsettias) to individuals and businesses in Guanajuato during the holiday season. The large plants, which are decorated with foil and ribbon, make great gifts as well as attractive decorations for the home

and beautiful, long-lasting additions to the garden. Our price again this year was 80 pesos (US \$6) apiece, and proceeds from sales support our spay/neuter, rescue, and public-education activities.

Demand for the plants has been growing. This year we sold 290 plants, about 100 more than last year. Amigos volunteers brought the plants from a nursery to the city, wrapped them in foil paper, tied a ribbon around each pot, and delivered the plants to several locations where the purchasers could pick them up either before Thanksgiving or in early December.
